Here are the highlights of the meeting:

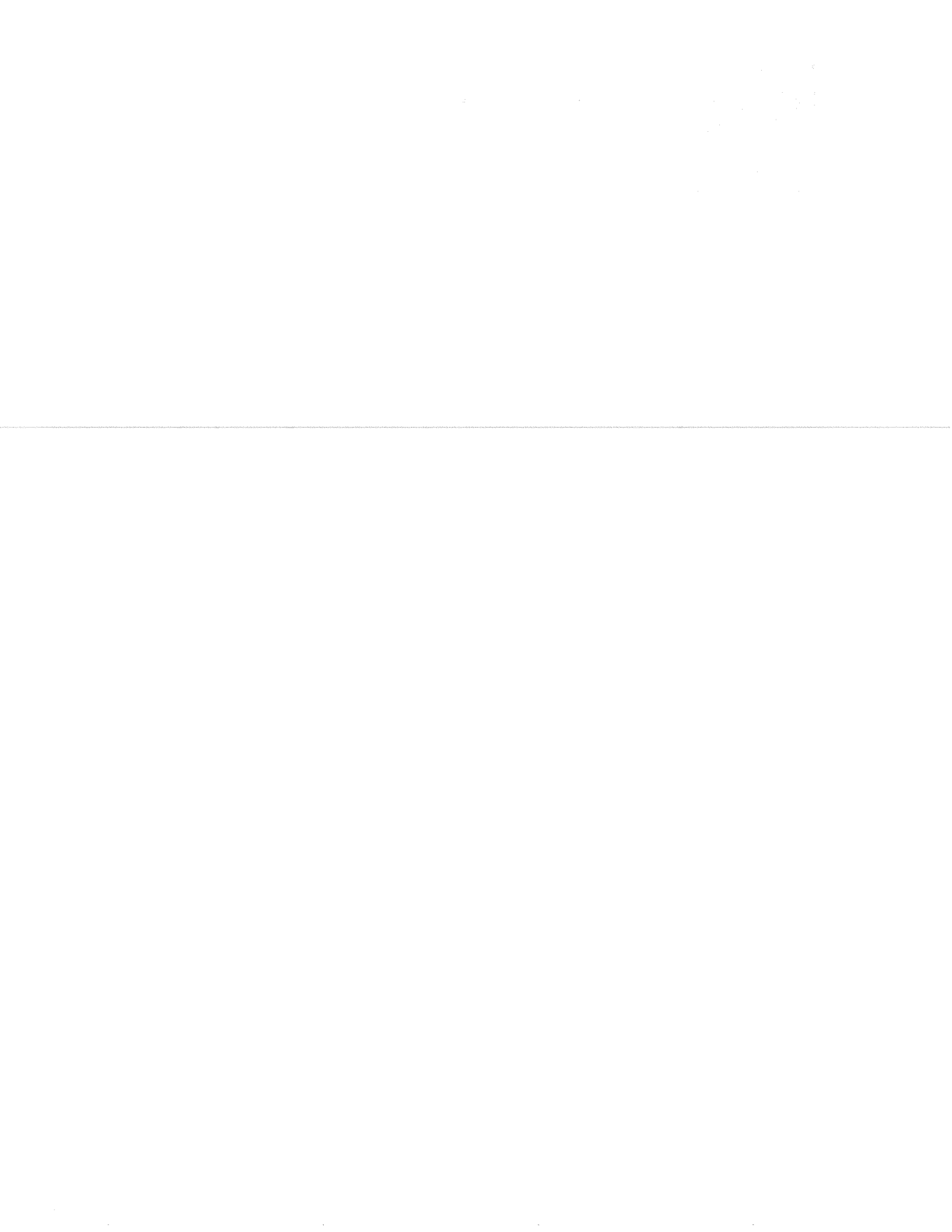

Meeting Minutes

- I. The regular meeting of the Board of Delegates of the Wisconsin Area Camera Clubs Organization (WACCO) was called to order by President Jerry Robillard on Saturday, February 5, 2000, at the FirstStar Bank in Butler at 9:06 am.

Based on the Attendance Sheet, 16 delegates (representing 12 clubs) and 3 officers were in attendance.

- II. It was moved to approve the minutes from the last meeting. No corrections were made. Bill Rietz made the motion and Laurie Braun seconded. The motion was approved unanimously.

New delegates were introduced Laurie Braun of the Wehr Nature Center Camera Club and Al Godwin of the Unlimited Vision Camera Club.

- III. Reports of the Officers and Committees.

- A. President's Report: All the president would report on will be covered in the Competition Committee report.

- B. Executive Committee: No official meeting during the last three months. No report this month. Jerry said the committee does not meet as a separate entity anymore but meets unofficially with the competition and program committees.

- C. Vice President's Report: No report.

- D. Secretary's Report: There are updated rosters and camera club brochures. Please pick them up and if there are any corrections, please let Paul Moertl know.

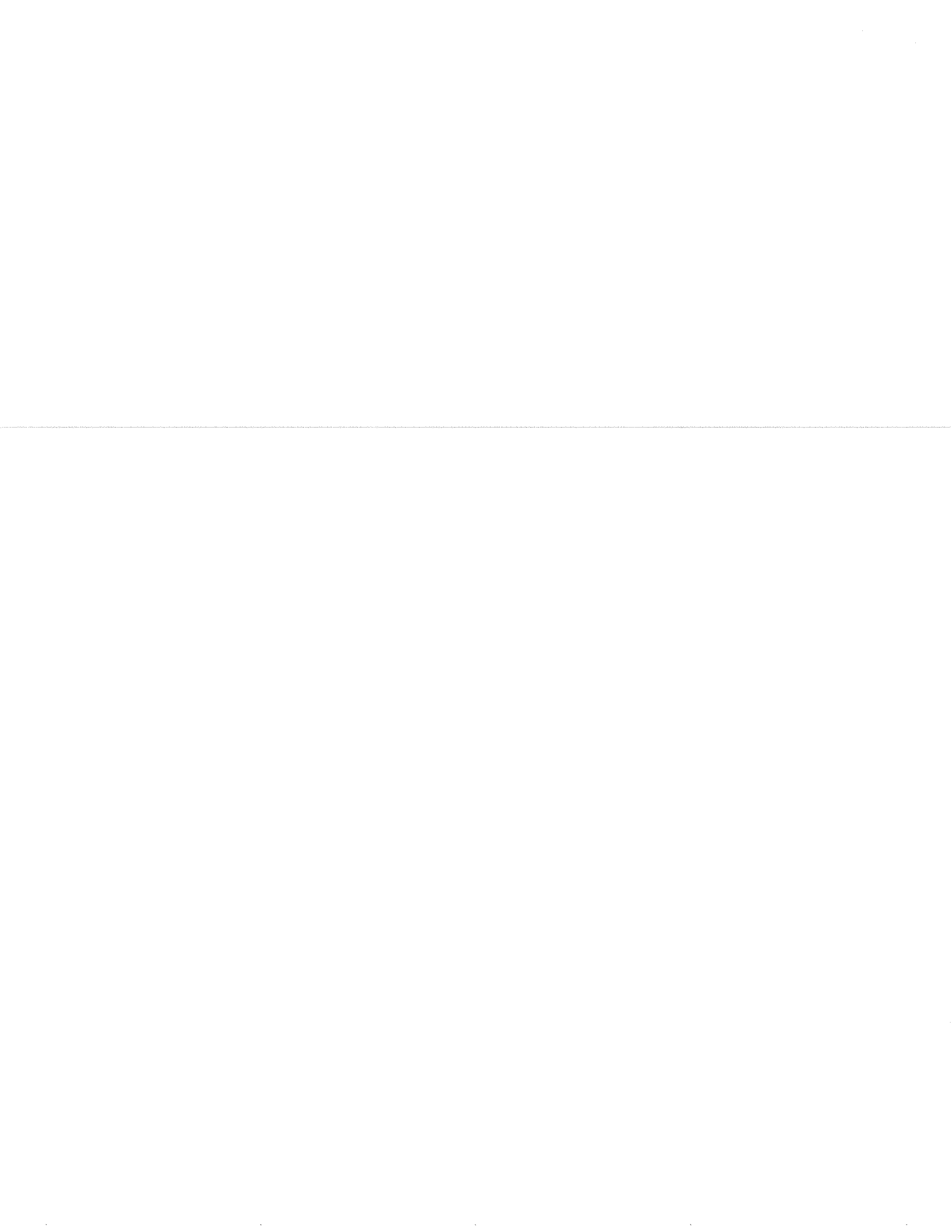
There were also updated camera club brochures, which now include the Focal Point Camera Club. Copies of the WACCO bylaws were also passed out to the delegates from Focal Point and In Focus Camera Clubs.

- E. Treasurer's Report: Jeff Klug was unable to attend the meeting, so Bill Rietz gave the Treasurer's Report. Current balance of \$7,4441.20 in the bank. See the printed report.

- F. Competition Committee: Scott passed out the categories for the next WACCO competitions through Fall 2001. They are enclosed. The Rhinelander Competition for September 30th was discussed. If the delegates meeting was held as usual in November, people would have more time for photography. We could have a showing of the competition winners in the Milwaukee area on November 4th. Why go all the way up to Rhinelander for photographing fall colors, and take some time away with a delegates meeting? It was suggested that the showing be at the FirStar in Butler. Jeff Tamms said it is very difficult to darken the room enough for a showing. It was moved by Gerry Emmerich and seconded by Rick Kempfer to have the competition in Rhinelander on September 30, and the delegates meeting on November 4th. Approved. The competition will be midday on Saturday.

The competition committee will look into a showing November 4th. The slides will need to be held for about a month longer in order to do this. The entrants will need to be told this. The delegates will need to tell their club members that their slides could be held for a longer time, if there will be a showing of the slides. It was mentioned that it should be on the Fall Competition Entry form if we do the showing.

Scott looked into costs of motel rooms up in the Rhinelander area and handed out a print of a web site listing of a number of them. Scott will set aside a block of 20 rooms at the Holiday Inn. He will set aside more if needed. He handed out a questionnaire to the delegates to pass out at their clubs asking how many club members would go up for the weekend and will need rooms. Campground information will be made available, too.



It was mentioned that the best time for color at Bond falls is 2pm - 5pm. The falls are about 2 hours away from Rhinelander. The Competition Committee will put together a list of other photo opportunities, too. This will be available at the May meeting.

The committee wants to use 3 WACCO members for the May Competition. The purpose of using WACCO judges is to test to see if we can do it and if it works. This is not a training ground but will be adding to the experience of the people judging. There will not be a husband-wife combination of judges, nor would there be someone judging their spouse's entries. The Competition Guidelines state that judges must come from outside of WACCO and only in an emergency can a WACCO member judge. Scott said he is declaring an emergency. A vote must be made to suspend the rules temporarily. A motion was made by Jeff Tamms to suspend the rules for the Spring Competition Year 2000 allowing up to 3 WACCO members as judges. They will not compete nor will their spouses/significant others/ etc, compete. Seconded by Gerry Emmerich. It was questioned if we were having trouble getting outside judges and it was also mentioned that outside judges are immune to hard feelings. This was acknowledged, but this is a test to see if we can get 3 qualified WACCO judges. We are not having any difficulty finding judges outside of WACCO. Jerry said that CACCA uses judges from within CACCA all the time and it works for them. Motion was passed.

Scott is still working on the CACCA/WACCO competition. Jerry Robillard has information for Scott regarding meetings of CACCA and competitions, so Scott can go down and talk to them.

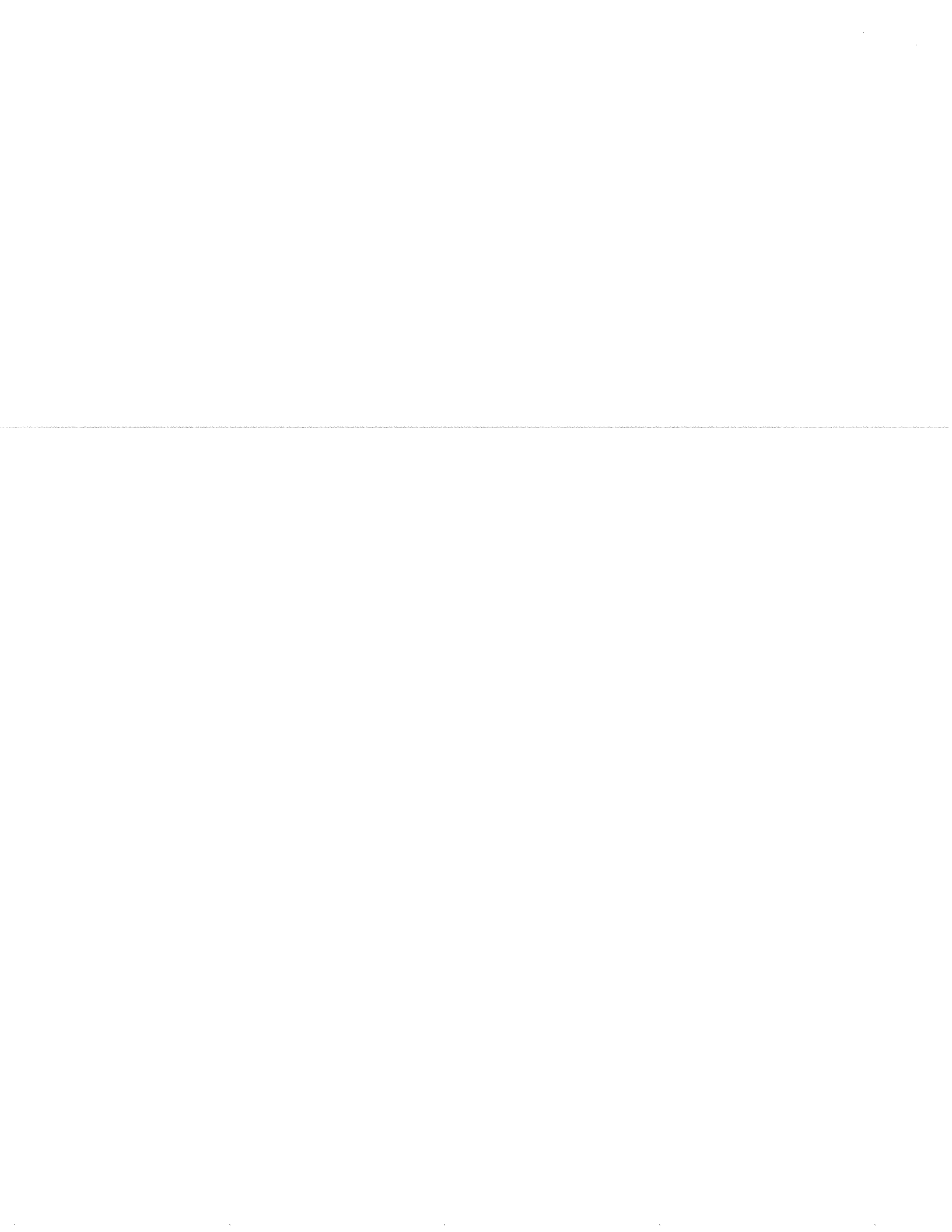
It was brought up that the meeting room's rent at FirStar is covered by the Photo Pictorialists. Jeff Tamms said that they are not reimbursed by WACCO at the present time.

- G. Program Committee: Jeff is out of town, so Bill Rietz filled in. Bill asked if any membership questionnaires were still out. Fliers for the March 18th workshop are still available and will be put out for the general public. We have 25 people signed up so far. Delegates were asked to take some to put out at local camera clubs.
- H. Public Relations: No Report.
- I. Membership: Gerry Emmerich reported that he was given a brochure for the Urban Ecology Center Camera Club of Milwaukee, associated with Riverside Park. He asked if anyone knew anything about the club. It meets behind Riverside High School. Rumors are that Rollie Kohl is the president. They meet the 2nd Thursday of the month. Jeff Tamms will contact them. Gerry will be going to the Arboretum Camera Club in Madison to make a presentation of the Wisconsin International slide show and ask if they would like to send a member to the May WACCO meeting to see if they would be interested in WACCO. Gerry also said he will put together a short Bond Falls show to be presented as part of his total presentation at the WACCO Seminar on the 18th. Gerry also gave a preview of what he will be doing at the seminar.
- J. Wisconsin International: Jeff Tamms handed out entry forms and said that the International closes on April 22nd. Kenosha and WACCO will be judged April 29-30; Image Makers and Fox Valley will be judged June 3 -4. Color Slides and Photojournalism will be the two categories. There will be no rebate for the WACCO seminar for any members that entered the Fall Competition. The reason is that the seminar was not announced by the time of the Fall Competition. There may be one for the Bobbi Lane seminar based on entrants of the Spring Competition. Jeff also said that the 1999 International show is available for clubs to use.

Dennis Grundman of the Fox Valley Camera Club has their old print box in his garage and it is available for free to any club that would like it. The Fox Valley club has a new one built to PSA standards and doesn't need the old one anymore. Judy Ollech said that she will take it. Fred Frisque also has one available for free.

Gerry Emmerich announced a list of showings of the 2000 International at various places around the state. The preliminary list is enclosed.

- K. Awards: No Report.



- IV. Old Business: Kathy Braun said that a club sponsor for refreshments at the Young Photographers Showcase is still needed. Please contact Kathy if interested. There are 157 entries this year. The reception will be March 16 at Milwaukee City Hall.
- V. New Business: Jerry Robillard mentioned that Freda Schurch fell and broke bones in her knee. She is currently in a nursing home recuperating. Taylor Mackey had quadruple bypass surgery and is doing well. Scott has a 2nd place ribbon from the competition and wondered if anyone knew whose it is.
- VI. Motion to adjourn by Clarence Miller, Gerry Emmerich seconded. Approved. The meeting was adjourned at 10:42 am.

Here are the highlights of the meeting:

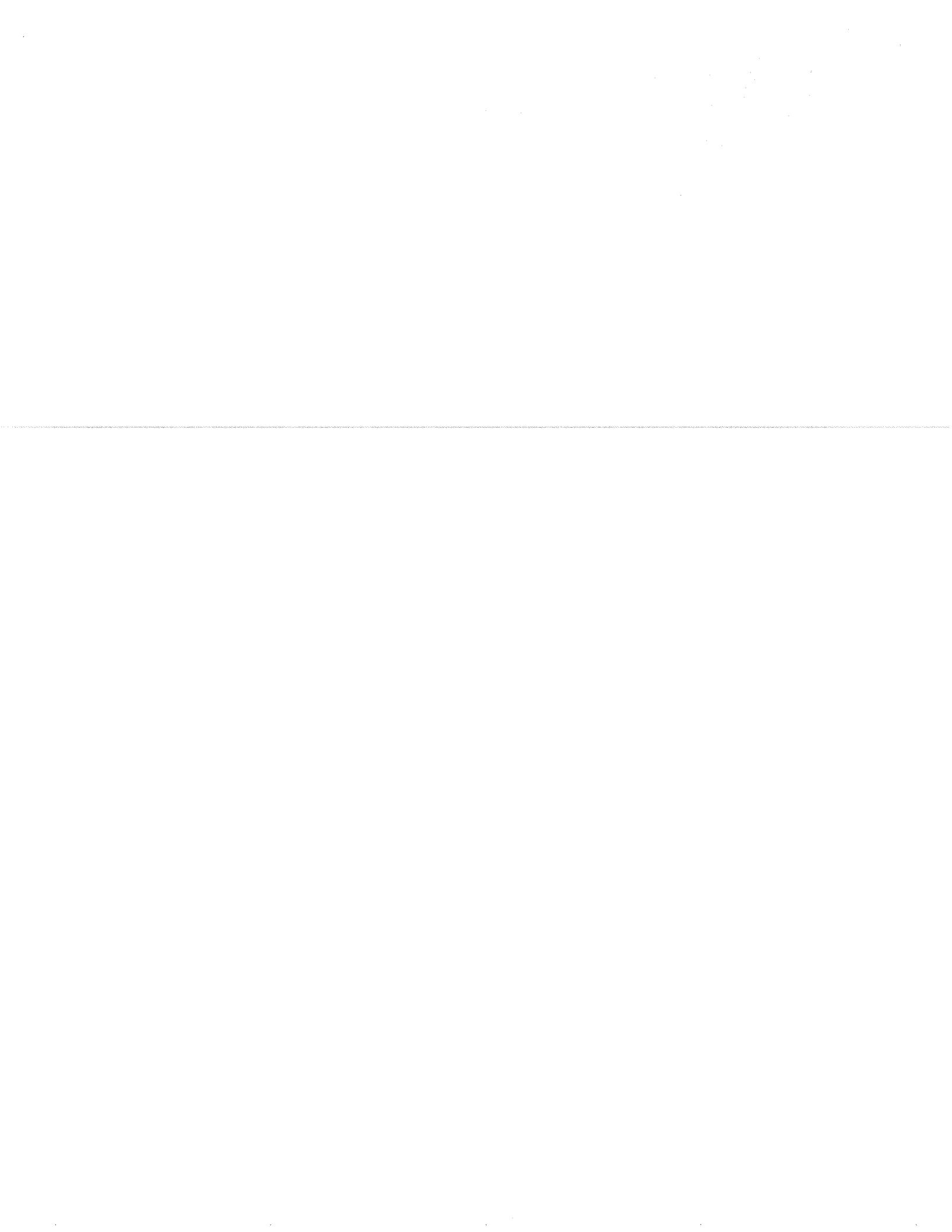

Meeting Minutes

- I. The regular meeting of the Board of Delegates of the Wisconsin Area Camera Clubs Organization (WACCO) was called to order by President Jerry Robillard on Saturday, May 6, 2000, at Best Western Midway Hotel at 9:12 am.

Based on the Attendance Sheet, 19 delegates (representing 13 clubs) and 4 officers were in attendance.

- II. It was moved to approve the minutes from the last meeting. No corrections were made. Jack Worthen made the motion and Alan Hanson seconded. The motion was approved unanimously.

- III. Reports of the Officers and Committees.

A. President's Report: No report.

B. Vice President's Report: No report.

C. Secretary's Report: There are camera club brochures and updated rosters, and with the anticipation that the Riverside Camera Club will be joining today, that club was included in the roster. Please pick them up and if there are any corrections, please let Paul Moertl know.

D. Treasurer's Report: Jeff Klug gave the Treasurer's Report. Current balance of \$6,899.74 in the bank. See the printed report. We netted a total of \$17.35 on the March 18th Seminar.

E. Executive Committee: No report this month. Jerry said the committee does not meet as a separate entity anymore but meets unofficially with the program committee. Since the program committee did not have a meeting this month, there was no executive committee meeting either.

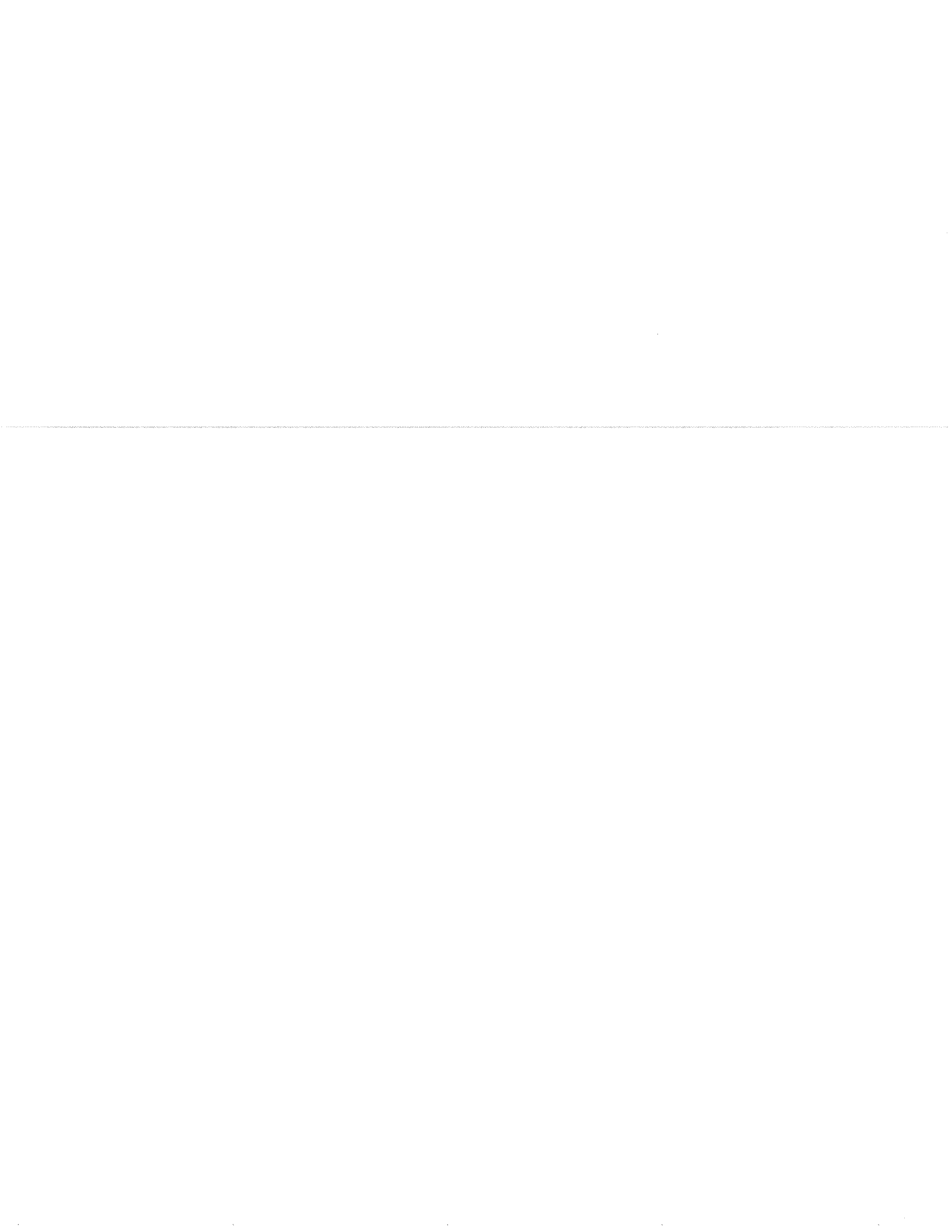
F. Competition Committee: Scott said that Steve Haynes had to bow out as a judge, as there was a death in the family. Need someone who does not have any slides entered. Jeff Tamms volunteered.

Scott has reserved a total of 30 rooms in Rhinelander at the Holiday Inn for the September 30 competition. We need to cancel the rooms that will not be used by July 1st. The rooms are \$57.00 per night, and anyone who wants one should identify themselves as part of WACCO to get the rate. Gerry Emmerich will try to get some judges from the Twin Cities area. Jeff Tamms suggested John Rothschild in Wausau. It was suggested that since we must be out of the auditorium by 4:00 pm, that we start at 11:00 am. No delegates meeting. The list entry form for the competition is available and Jeff Klug passed some out. A question arose if there is a list of good places to go for shooting. Scott said not yet, but there will be something at the August meeting.

Vince Condella will show the Best of Show and category winners during his weather broadcasts on May 10 and 11. He will need the original slides and prints. It was not known when the pictures will be specifically shown.

Help is needed with the competition - slide handlers, score keepers, etc. Any volunteers will be welcome.

There are 5 entrants in the B Group and 57 in A Group. Someone asked if there were less than 10 entrants in the B group, weren't they moved to A? Scott and Jeff replied that there was an amendment to lower the limit to 3 or more entrants. And if there is only one entrant in the B group special category, that person will get the plaque. Delegates were asked to push the B group to get the less experienced photographers involved and hopefully move up. It is their choice whether or not to remain in the B group. It is an honor system and Jeff has not seen any abuse so far. Plaques are already ordered for the B group, but if no winners in a category, they can have a new plate put on cheaply. B group winners compete in the Best of Show, too. Delegates are urged to encourage less experienced photographers to enter in the B group. It was also noted that entrants that



currently enter in the A group can move into the B group. There is currently no B group in the Nature division, but that will be discussed at the next competition committee meeting.

It was brought up that some people are unfamiliar with filling out the entry forms and setting up the slides, etc. for the competition. Delegates are urged to help these people to do this. Scott will have a handout for this at the August meeting. Gerry Emmerich stated that there are people that would be glad to come to your club to help with this. Jeff Tamms would be glad to set up a short seminar just before a competition for delegates to fill out everything if needed. The delegates could take this information back to their clubs. Jerry Robillard asked if someone could put this into a visual form. It was brought up that the Delegates Handbook has the information. This will be looked at again by the competition committee.

It was also noted that the Nicolet College will be charging us \$10.00 per hour for use of the facility. This would be a maximum of \$50.00 for the competition.

- G. Program Committee: There were 34 people at the March 18th seminar. WACCO netted \$17.35 total. It was held here and the facilities/food were very good. We will probably hold more here.

Bobbi Lane brochures are available. Take some back to your clubs. People signing up for the seminar can deduct \$5.00 for each division they enter in today's WACCO competition, with a maximum of \$20.00 off. Judges will get some other reduction. Jeff is also looking for 4 or 5 models for the afternoon session. They will be paid \$50.00 for the afternoon. Contact Jeff if you know of any available models.

Jeff is also looking for speakers for next year's seminar. Any ideas? Big names are expensive (\$3,000 - \$10,000). Whether it will be held in the fall or spring has not yet been decided.

- H. Public Relations: Apparently, the secretary is an automatic assignment. Ellen has been sending information to the papers on her own.

- I. Membership: Gerry Emmerich gave the report. There will be an application from a new club in New Business.

Gerry is in continued contact with the Madison club, but doubts they will join. They are primarily a nature club meeting about 6 times a year at the Arboretum.

Jeff Klug brought up that the Janesville club has not yet paid their dues for the year. Gerry has tried to contact their representative, but no response. Jeff has sent them 2 letters, but again, no response. Gerry suggested talking to Bob Schaap, since he was the original contact for them.

- J. Wisconsin International: Jeff Tamms gave the report. The entrants were down about 10% in the open category, 25% in the photojournalism. He said that exhibitions all over the world are experiencing lower participation. The Wisconsin Exhibition is considering a nature division next year. Jeff noted only 17 Wisconsin people entered. The WACCO exhibition had the following Wisconsin winners: Wisconsin Medal - highest cumulative score by a Wisconsin maker - tie between Lynn Rieger and Bob Schaap. Best image by a Wisconsin maker - Kathy Braun. Gerry Emmerich won best image in the Kenosha exhibition.

Gerry also brought a revised list of showings of the 2000 International at various places around the state. It is about a 2 hour show. The updated list is enclosed. The showing is also available as a program for camera clubs.

- K. Awards: No Report. If you have any award nominations, drop a line to Bill Rietz.



IV. Old Business: Jeff Klug said the non-profit papers have been filed.

Scott Mulcahy has not been in contact with Mike Crivello's regarding web page availability. Scott will also get the CACCA - WACCO competition rolling. Al Christenson will be handling it.

Jerry Robillard made an observation. He went to a camera club in Fox Lake Illinois and it has 31 members. Primarily nature. Kenosha is struggling with 13 members.

V. New Business: Application for membership by the Riverside Camera Club. Gerry Emmerich made motion to accept the club, Jeff Tamms seconded. Passed unanimously. Rollie Kohl is one of the delegates. James Lewis the other. The club meets at the Urban Ecology Center. The club is looking forwards to entering WACCO competitions.

Don Frisque heard that there is a club in Green Bay. He asked if anyone else knows of this club. Jack Worthen mentioned that he knew of one some years ago but did not know if it was still operating. Don will follow up.

Jack Worthen brought up that there is a program by PSA for camera clubs. as Chapters Chair, Jack has also been given the responsibility of this major program. Clubs need only mail in the PSA Club Representative card with the name of one member of the club that will handle all correspondence with PSA. Wisconsin is region 21, and Gerry Emmerich is the regional director. Gerry also brought up that there will be an interclub competition between PSA clubs here in Wisconsin.

Question - does PSA rep have to be a PSA member? No. The club needs to pay \$43.00/year and the rep will have all PSA privileges.

Question - Did they have this program before? This program was in place, but there was not a large response.

The next delegates meeting will be at Firststar Building in Butler, August 5th. The November meeting will also be at the same place.

Gerry Emmerich said he could put on a slide dissolve show after the November meeting from the September competition. He would need to keep the slides through that time frame. Jeff Tamms noted that the room we have will probably not be able to be dark enough. The competition committee will look into this.

VI. Motion to adjourn by Gerry Emmerich, Taylor Mackey seconded. Approved. The meeting was adjourned at 10:28 am.

## Program Committee Report

### Program 1

Bobbi Lane will be a two part seminar - a workshop on available light portraits which was requested by us for another seminar in July 2000. It would be a 1/2 day seminar and a 1/2 day workshop, the workshop would be limited to approximately 30 people per 1/2 day which we could do two 1/2 day workshops. Meeting Minutes

- I. The regular meeting of the Board of Delegates of the Wisconsin Area Camera Clubs Organization (WACCO) was called to order by President Jerry Robillard on Saturday, August 5, 2000, at the Firststar Bank building in Butler at 9:16 am.

Based on the Attendance Sheet, 15 delegates (representing 10 clubs) and all 4 officers were in attendance.

A new delegate, Jim Lewis, from the Riverside Camera Club was introduced and welcomed to the meeting.

- II. It was moved to approve the minutes from the last meeting. No corrections were made. Bill Rietz made the motion and Gerry Emmerich seconded. The motion was approved unanimously.

- III. Reports of the Officers and Committees.

A. President's Report: See Executive Committee Report.

B. Vice President's Report: Fred will put together a list of equipment, as this is his responsibility. As soon as he can get a list of equipment, he will do that. Jeff Tamms and Jeff Klug have most if not all of the equipment between the two of them (Jeff T. has the projector and scoring machine, Jeff K. has the screen, etc.). Jeff Tamms mentioned that WACCO has a Fuji 645 camera, but it has disappeared. It was a trophy, and we don't know who has it currently. Jerry asked if everyone has a list of what is in the library. The secretary will put a copy of the equipment list and the audio-visual list in the minutes. Gerry Emmerich questioned whether we should develop the WACCO library when we don't know what is in the library.

Jeff Tamms said that the set of slides for the WACCO 2000 exhibition are available. Menomonee Falls will use it in September, as will the Stevens Point/Wausau clubs. Fstop has it reserved it for the last Tuesday in October. Medal winners and a good cross-section of the Color Slide division and the Photojournalism division are in the program. This is a good program for when a club has a cancelled program or a fill-in program. Free of charge, just return postage needed.

C. Secretary's Report: There is an updated club roster available. Please pick them up and if there are any corrections, please let Paul Moertl know. His email address is included if you prefer to communicate in that mode.

D. Treasurer's Report: Jeff Klug gave the Treasurer's Report. Dues are due, normally before the competition. Since, however, the competition is in September, they are due by November. We have a total of \$5998.50 in the bank. We are in the hole for the year about \$1500.00. We are slowly losing money. Jeff made up a budget for the next year, in which he expects to make about \$70.00. Another seminar is not planned, but Jeff expects any seminar to be pretty close to a break-even proposition. We are losing money in the competitions, about \$200 - \$300 each time because of the room rentals, plaques, expenses for the judges, etc. Jeff Tamms said isn't it about time to raise the entry fee to \$5.00 per category. Jeff Klug says that if we lost \$1500.00 each year, we will be broke in 4 years. Competition costs are probably the easiest place to come up with more money. The airport location costs us, the UW-W location is a break-even location. Plaques are almost \$300.00 per competition. The philosophy in the past was lots of ribbons and plaques to get people to participate. It has helped in Class B - new people have been participating, and that makes the expense well worth it. Ribbons are up to almost \$1.00 each. The big blue runner-up ribbons are around \$10.00 each, too. Gerry Emmerich raised a motion to raise entry fees from \$4.00 to \$5.00, Laurie Braun seconded. Plaques can be made smaller and cheaper. Jeff Tamms suggested that it be referred to the competition committee to will look into ways to cut expenses. The motion was withdrawn and referred to the competition committee. Ellen Worzala noted that the number of individual participants in May of '99 was 61, November of '99 it was 66, but in May of '00 there were only 45 participants. That drop cost us a lot of money. It was noted that if we drop below



about 60 participants, we seem to lose money. Our administrative costs are high, such as brochures and medals, plaques, etc., and our only income sources are club dues, programs, and competitions. To make more money, we need to increase these sources. We lost money on the last program. We may need to rethink what we do for programs. Jeff Tamms suggested that maybe part of the answer for this was that we had different dates for the programs, not the usual spring time. Jeff Klug wondered if the club members are getting the information from the delegates. They have to do this for our programs to work. We cannot afford to advertise in the newspaper or other ways. We need a PR committee for this. Taylor Mackey asked to please put this into committee.

- E. Executive Committee: Jerry Robillard expressed concern that there is a lack of communication between the delegates and the camera clubs. Jerry doesn't think that information is getting to the clubs. For example, the last seminar was very poorly attended, and he wondered if the information on the Bobbi Lane seminar was given to the clubs by the delegates.

Also, Taylor Mackey has agreed to chair the nominations committee for this next year. We are all in this group to make things work, and we need volunteers that will come forward and stick with it. If any of the delegates are interested in doing any of the officer jobs, please contact Taylor. Or, if you know anyone in the clubs that would be interested, please let Taylor know of these people as well.

- F. Competition Committee: Fall competition ready for Rhinelander. We have judges, two from the Twin Cities, one from Rothschild. All three are experienced. Scott wondered if we can pay the judges for a room for one or two nights and/or expenses for travelling. Gerry Emmerich moved that the Sedio's get two nights lodging, since they are from Minnesota, but nothing for John Larsen who lives in Rothschild, which is very close. Al Godwin seconded. Passed.

Bill Reitz moved to create a competition subcommittee so non-delegates such as Ellen Worzala can participate. Taylor Mackey seconded. Passed.

We now have 20 rooms at the Holiday Inn set aside. 10 have been taken. We have until September 1st before the rooms become available to the general public.

Delegates are charged with getting the information about the competition to your clubs.

Vince Condella will show some of the winners during his weather broadcasts on October 9, 10, and 11.

Mike Crivello's web site will be back up in early fall. Please give Scott updated camera club information for the site. The WACCO clubs will be put on the web site.

Al Christiansen is working with CACCA for the WACCO/CACCA competition. It is on the table until fall, with a possible competition in Spring 2001. No categories have been decided yet. There is another organization that may be interested in the competition, too - The Central Illinois Council of Camera Clubs (CLCCC). This would have us be the host only every third year. Fees will have to be discussed.

- G. Program Committee: Bobbi Lane program lost money. We had 11 people for the morning seminary, 18 for all day. We lost \$463.00 for the program. Jeff Klug moved the afternoon seminar to his studio instead of the Community Center because of the low number of participants, and that helped save some money. Everyone present enjoyed the program.

There is nothing on the horizon. No more big names for a while, because of this last experience. It was a lot of work for Jeff and the return was not great enough. One possibility is a digital seminar in fall of 2001 (not a CAPS year), and possibly a nature seminar as well. Nothing for the spring.

It was asked if there will there be a show of the competition at the next delegates meeting. The decision was made that the meeting will be here at Firststar, but that it will be too difficult to make it dark in the room. No program will be presented.



Jerry asked who reserved the room for today. No one did. Jeff Tamms said that Jim Larkin was the one that reserved the room for the Photo Pictorialists. Jeff Tamms will make sure that Firststar will be reimbursed for the room. Jim Larkin will reserve the room 9:00 - 11:00 the first Saturday in November for the delegates meeting.

Jeff Klug mentioned that he has a list of waterfalls within 70 miles of Rhinelander on the back of the Competition report. Jack Worthen noted that the first meeting of the Fox Valley Camera Club will be at Lawrence University on East College Avenue in Appleton on September 19 at 7:00 pm. The speaker will be Patrick Lisi, a Wisconsin Conservation Warden who has written a profusely illustrated book on Wisconsin Waterfalls, giving a talk on waterfalls. He will be selling his book, as well.

- H. Public Relations: No report.
- I. Membership: Gerry Emmerich gave the report. Nothing new in membership. He does not think the Madison club will join. Gerry has also set up a competition with the camera clubs that are members of PSA. See Gerry if your club is interested in joining PSA.
- J. Wisconsin International: Jeff Tamms gave the report. 2000 catalogs were mailed out. the 2001 exhibition is set up one day earlier than last year. April will have Image Makers and Unlimited Vision sponsored exhibitions, June will have Photo Pictorialists and WACCO sponsored exhibitions. Jeff Klug moved that WACCO sponsor the exhibition next year, seconded by Taylor Mackey. Passed.

Jeff also mentioned that any club can make a donation to sponsor a medal for the WACCO exhibition.

- K. Awards: No Report.

IV. Old Business: None.

V. New Business: Please take a sheet on the Young Photographers Showcase.

VI. Motion to adjourn by Jack Worthen, Taylor Mackey seconded. Approved. The meeting was adjourned at 10:50 am.

### GETTING INVOLVED IN OPYP

You love photography. You're good. But have you ever considered passing your knowledge on to others? Working with high school students can be a most rewarding experience.

The OPYP program is, basically, the securing of up to five prints (one in each category) from a high school to be sent to the PSA Director of Youth Activities each May. Your degree of involvement is entirely up to you.

The least amount of involvement is when you're working with a strong teacher whose students are or have been involved in other photography programs. Although it is preferred to have you involved in the selection, the teacher and students may choose their own entries and have you send them in as your club's/chapter's entries.

At the other extreme, participation would involve you and members of your club taking part in class activities as mentors for the students, helping them through various stages of taking and printing a photograph. Your club may want to make a local contest of the selection and provide prizes for the winners. You might even display the entries at some local establishment.

In any case, the first step is to find a photography class. You may contact your local high school or check with the school district's central office. Explain the program, show the explanatory letter and program description (which we will furnish you), and ask how you could help the teacher participate in the OPYP program.

## GETTING INVOLVED WITH YOUNG PHOTOGRAPHERS

Here are some hints for getting your PSA club or chapter involved with young photographers in the Outstanding Photographs from Young Photographers program. Hope they help you.

1. Find out from the school administration building in your district which schools have photography classes. I found it very helpful to work through the art department.
2. Contact and/or meet with the photography teachers, explaining the rules of the OPYP program: categories, number of prints chosen, unmounted, dates, etc.
3. It helps if you furnish them with the rules and categories in writing. Feel free to make copies of the enclosed materials.
4. When the students submit their works, choose, along with someone else from your club or chapter, a print for each category from each high school. If you have five participating high schools, then each school can enter a landscape, each school can enter an architecture, and so forth. (You could end up with 25 entries for OPYP.)
5. If your club or chapter is so inclined, you may want to offer nominal cash prizes to the winners (or some other such award, certificates definately!!!)
6. Arrange to have the photos displayed somewhere (the district administration building if you can't get a bank or hall somewhere) either before you send them to the director of the OPYP program or after they are returned. Do this even if you are working with a single school. Motivation makes the program successful.
7. If you get much involvement, you may want to notify the local news media for some publicity.

These hints can be carried out as much as you want to be involved. You may simply want to contact a school, look at their prints, and send in prints in as many categories as possible. Just remember that your involvement must be through a PSA club or chapter, even if all the work is done by only one individual. Good results can become contagious.

- 4. Programs may be picked up and returned to the Librarian by appointment only, or they may be received from and returned to the Librarian by United Parcel Service (UPS). Clubs are responsible for paying all postage. (Note: UPS does not deliver to a Post Office Box. In the event that delivery is to a Post Office Box, or if shipment by UPS is not feasible, shipment must be made by U.S. Priority Mail with the program being insured for \$100.00.**
- 5. Program materials ( videos, slides, cassette tape, and script booklet) must be returned intact. It should be noted if you have experienced any difficulties with any of the materials.**
- 6. When requesting the use of a program, a first choice date and an alternate date should be given. Requests should be made at least three (3) weeks in advance so that availability can be determined and delivery made.**
- 7. Clubs will receive a letter of confirmation that will indicate an approximate delivery date and include instructions for the program's return (or instructions where to forward the program). Programs must be returned (or forwarded) by the date indicated in the letter of confirmation.**
- 8. Two postcards will also be included with the confirmation letter. The first postcard must be returned when the program arrives. The second post card must be returned when you send the program back. The second postcard should indicate the date and the method (preferably UPS) the program was returned and the receipt number. (This is important information in the event a search for a missing program must be made.)**

Jeff announced that the following camera clubs, according to his records, have not paid their WACCO dues: F-Stop, Kenosha, Milwaukee, Racine, and In Focus. If you have paid, thank you.

E. Executive Committee: No report.

F. Competition Committee: The committee will look at ways to keep costs down. Report will be given at the February meeting.

A new print category for the next competition - Class C (print size of 100 square inches or less). This will include any picture printed at home, commercially, or by computer. Must be mounted (mount should be larger than the print). This could generate more participation. Delegates were asked to go to clubs and tell members about this new category. Suggested minimum size is 3-1/2 x 5 inches.

The Class B open slide category is experiencing a dropoff in entries. Delegates are asked to go back to their clubs and reiterate that the class exists for less-experienced photographers.

Last competition: 45 people entered 180 open slides; 40 people entered 153 entries; 14 people entered color prints; 11 people entered black and white prints. \$440.00 in entry fees, \$512.00 in expenses so far (\$100.00 room rental not yet paid as of meeting date). Higher fees were considered, but there is much resistance. Lower costs might be attained by cheaper plaques and medals, more entries, etc.

Wehr camera club will do the May 5, 2001 competition at the Midway Airport. Wausau club - In Focus - was showing an interest in the November competition.



G. Program Committee: No report. The committee will take suggestions for programs next fall.

WACCO-CACCA competition is still in the talking stages. Possible time of a competition is November 2001, since that is an off-year for CAPS (Chicago Area Photographic School). This could be a possible program or maybe given to the competition committee.

Other possible organizations for future interaction: Central Illinois (Peoria); N4C (La Crosse and Northern Iowa); Twin Cities CCC; SWMCCC

H. Public Relations: No report.

Judges were discussed. Out of state judges are frequently recruited by asking them at PSA conferences.

V. New Business: For PSA Clubs: The PSA Newsletter competition will be revived in 2001. It was cancelled last year due to an illness with the individual who ran it. It has been restructured so one person doesn't run it all anymore. There is a new PSA Camera Club Website contest. See the PSA Website ([www.psa-photo.org](http://www.psa-photo.org)) for details. It is for camera clubs, councils, and chapters. Also, please fill out the PSA Club Rep card and send it in so PSA has a valid up-to-date file for contact with your club.

Young Photographers Showcase - if you know any students that would be interested, please let Kathy Braun or Jack Worthen know. Any PSA club can sponsor any number of high school students. Any high schools are eligible, since it is now a national program. Only limit is the number of prints from any one school. If interested, please contact Kathy (262-375-1829) or Jack (920-733-4760).
