


While I enjoy photographing landscapes, my real passion is focusing on the smaller details in

I went through various plugins including Nik Silver Efex, but the secret didn't lie in a plugin. The magic is in shaping light using burning and dodging techniques. I've come up with a simple yet powerful method that I think you'll enjoy as much as my Rethink Lightroom process.
