

Special Theme Division Definitions

Nature Special Theme – Wisconsin Landscapes – Subject matter is a Wisconsin landscape image that does not rely on closeup detail to impart the nature story. Images that include roads, fences, mown or cultivated fields, or any other human element are not allowed. The appearance of the "Hand of Man" is prohibited. Furthermore, no manipulation is allowed except for cropping, exposure adjustments and dust sensor removal. No cloning to add or delete elements to the composition is allowed.

Open Special Theme – Tabletop/Still Life – A tabletop/still life image usually depicts a static arrangement of objects.

WACCO Competition Continued

A Short Summary of Each Division

Nature (color/monochrome) - You can not have anything that indicates the 'hand of man'. That means, no man-made paths or walkways, roads, cell towers, manicured grass, trimmed bushes or trees, stairs, empty bottles or litter, etc. These photos can only have a limited amount of editing. You CAN NOT REMOVE OR ADD anything to the original photo. You can crop, adjust color, brightness and saturation. You can remove dust spots.

You can submit up to 3 color and/or 3 monochrome images.

Limited Editing (color/monochrome) - Here you have a very wide latitude to edit a SINGLE PHOTO. You CAN remove distractions, adjust colors, crop, etc. Photos with 'hand of man' are acceptable. You can not add parts from other photos, graphics, brushes or add textures (i.e. no compositing). You can do just about any adjustments found in Lightroom or any removal tools in Photoshop or other similar editing programs.

You can submit up to 3 color and/or 3 monochrome images.

Open (color/monochrome) - Just about anything goes. You can composite any number of photos, textures or graphics AS LONG AS THEY ARE YOUR OWN creation/photos. Please read this section at the WACCO link to understand the few limitations.

You can submit up to 3 color and/OR 3 monochrome images.

Special Theme NATURE - This division follows the rules of the Nature division (no additions or removals and no hand of

man). This year the subject is **Wisconsin Landscapes**.

You can submit up to 3 images.

Special Theme OPEN - This division follows the rules of the Open division. This year the subject of *Tabletop/still life*.

You can submit up to 3 images.

The closing date for submitting your photos will be April 17, 2022 at midnight.

Once you have selected your photos, do not wait to the last moment to upload those photos. If many people try to add photos at the last minute, it is possible the up-loader may not be able to handle the volume and your photos may not be added. In addition, if this is your first time submitting photos, you need to register to show you are a member of this club. That process/approval can take a day or three.

You can enter a maximum of 24 photos — 3 photos in each of the 8 divisions.

(One charge of \$4.00 for up to 3 photos per division. Why not try three?)



I can help you create better photographic images, whether you are a beginner or are an advanced photographer.
