Bird Photography – Beyond the Basics 9:00 AM to 10:30 AM (Central time)

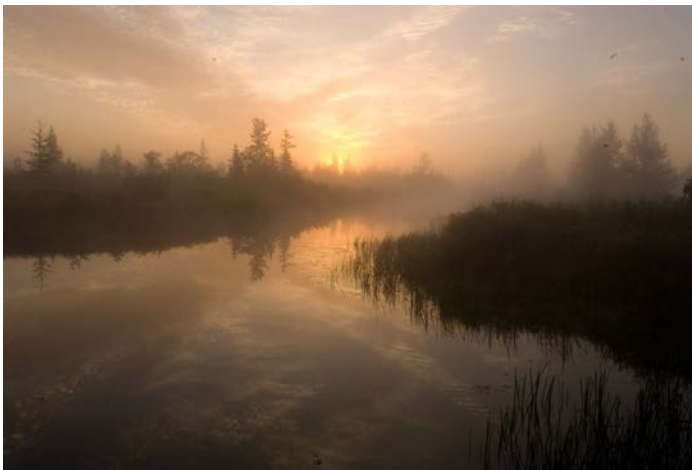

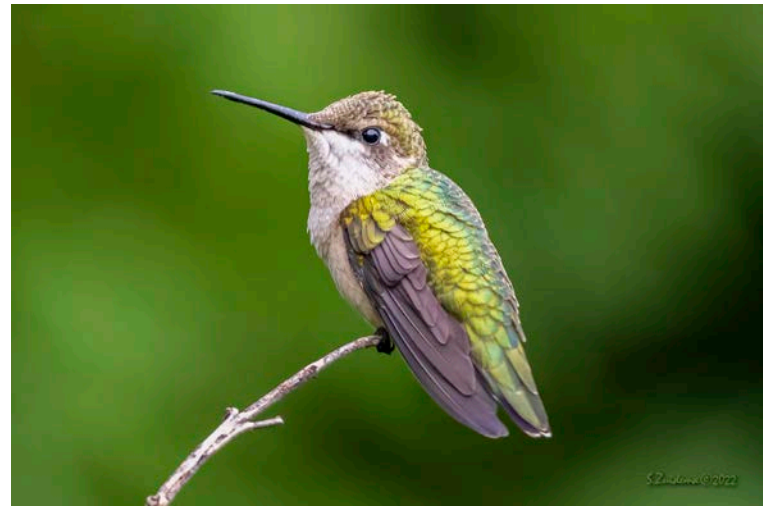

Casting a Light on: Creative Images Photo Club

Creative Images Photo Club was first organized in June 2003 by Keri Gerlach and Mary Kleist as Friends of Boerner Botanical Garden Photo Club. Later, the name was changed to Creative Images Photo Club. Keri worked at Boerner then and was instrumental in providing display cases at Boerner for our photos. When she changed jobs and moved to Clement Manor, we would put together an annual display of photos in their main hallway and at Boerner. Mary served as club president for many years and is still active. Today, Drema Swader and Roger Lange are the primary organizers of CIPC. For many years, we met at various classrooms at Boerner and conducted numerous photography workshops as part of Boerner's educational program. These workshops were organized and run by various members of CIPC, which not only helped nonmembers taking the class or workshop but made sure those presenting the class knew the material backward and forward as well. Many of our meetings also involved a fellow member presenting a topic and leading a discussion of some aspects of photography, as well as a monthly photo challenge and image review of our photos. In this way, we helped each other become better and more knowledgeable photographers. Some of our members also sold some of their photos through the gift shop at Boerner.

Today, we still consider Boerner our base of operations, but our monthly meetings are now on ZOOM, on the third Saturday of the month from 10:00 am to Noon. The main portion of our meetings is still our monthly photo challenges. These challenges are designed to get members to try something new and maybe even to get them out of their comfort level. This is the list of this year's challenges:

Every other month, Drema has gotten outstanding photographers from around the country to judge and review our photos. Club members submit several general category photos and at least one photo to meet the monthly challenge topic. We then ask the judges to point out things they like in each photo and make suggestions they would do, either in post-processing or while taking the photo, that might improve the photo. These image reviews have helped all of us develop a better eye when reviewing our own photographs. The judges also rate these photos as acceptable or not. Those rated acceptable are put on the home page of our website (creativephotoimages.org) and remain there for the month. Our meetings also include bringing in some outside experts to present topics to challenge us. Topics covered this past year included light painting, using Photo Pills, and using various modules in Lightroom and Photoshop.

We also schedule a monthly photo outing such as Mitchell Park Domes, Milwaukee Art Museum, Saint Josaphat Basilica, the Orchid Show at Milaeger's in Racine, a portrait studio where we were able to experiment with professional lighting and backgrounds, Boerner Botanical Gardens, and downtown Cedarburg as well as participating in WACCO's photo shoots.

CIPC is a small club of around 20 members with a very active core that is always looking to do more and learn more about our photography hobby. For further information, go to our website, creativephotoimages.org, or email roger.lange@yahoo.com

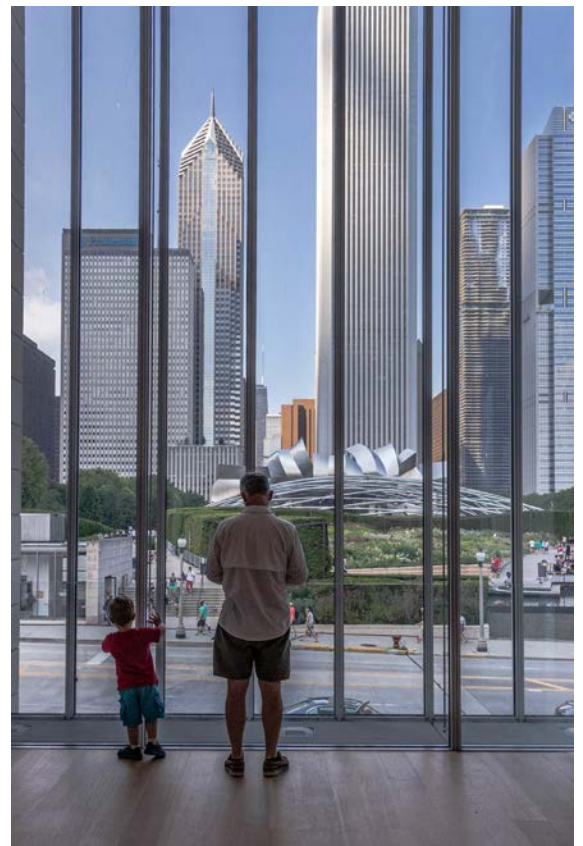

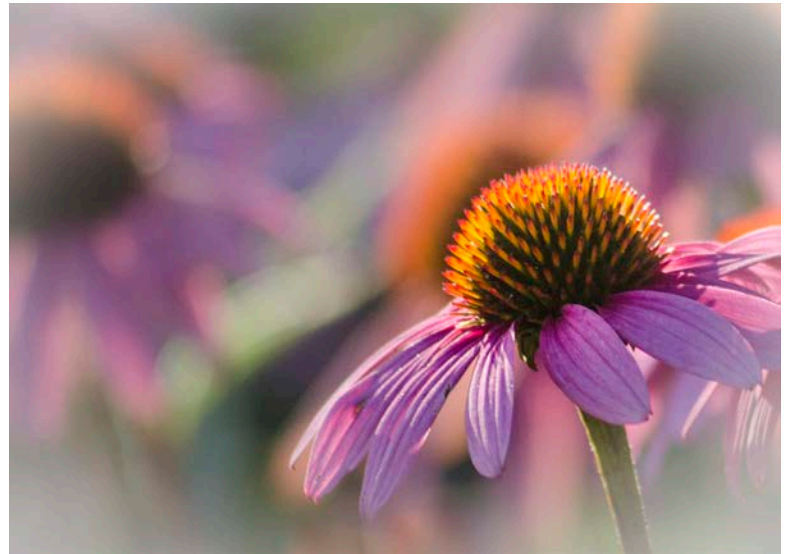

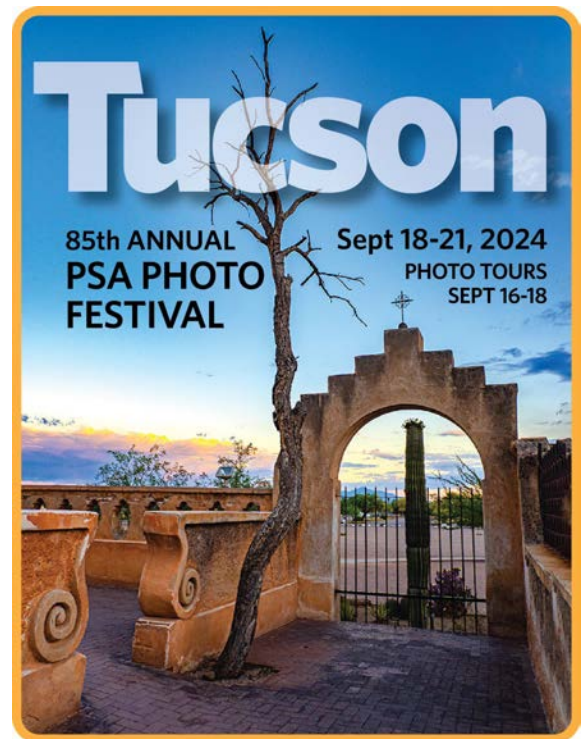
